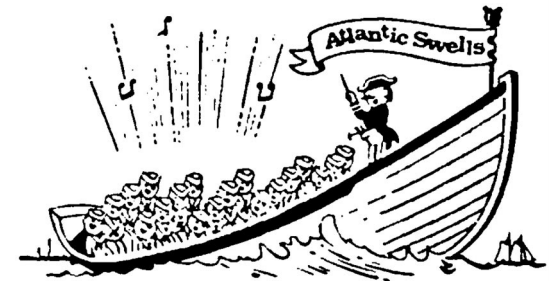
We are a friendly and supportive group, with men of all ages and from all walks of life, singing together in 4 part harmony. We like to look, sound and feel good...that what singing together is all about!

The Atlantic Swells are a men's barbershop chorus in Halifax which was founded over 35 years ago. There are still some of the founding members singing with us today.

We are members of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barbershop Quartet Singing in America (SPEBQSA) which was founded in 1938 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The membership is now about 32000 in North America and there are affiliated societies in many other countries. The Society has charitable projects, the main one being Heartspring which helps children with speech disabilities.

The Swells have been instrumental in helping with the establishment of barbershop choruses in both Dartmouth and Sackville. At a local level, our chapter (and other local chapters) support the Nova Scotia Hearing and Speech Clinic.

We are a small but active chorus with an upbeat repertoire. We perform regularly and compete annually in barbershop competitions. Last year we won the small chorus competition. We meet every Monday in Canadian Martyr's Church on the corner of Inglis Street and Tower Road at 7.30pm.
